Numerous commercial, national or international disputes are frequently solved by the means of arbitration. Drafting an arbitration clause is thus essential for the parties and their in house counsel.

The following questions will be dealt with:

- Is it more appropriate to choose an institutional (Cepani or ICC arbitration for instance) or ad hoc arbitration ?
- One or three arbitrators ?
- Which language must be chosen ?
- How to choose the seat of arbitration ? What are the consequences ?
- Which law must be chosen ? Could International principles like the Unidroit principles apply ?

In the case of multiparty arbitration must the clause be drafted differently ? Is it possible to join, through the drafting of the clause, the proceedings between all the parties?

- How to draft the clause so that disputes on extracontractual liabilities are included in the arbitration proceedings?
